







On the left under LIBRARY RESOURCES
Click on EBSCO (Online catalogs and articles)


Enter your Student ID number in the box as requested and click Login.



Put one search term in each box. Click the boxes next to Full Text and Scholarly (Peer Reviewed) Journals.






The detailed record view also includes this tools menu.

The Add to folder button allows you to keep a list of articles you would like to review later. Be aware that if you close your browser or your session times out the folder will be emptied.

The Cite button will help you cite the article in your paper. Be sure you check the citation given against the instructions given by your professor or the style guide you are using. The librarian can also help with citation questions.
