The purpose of an Independent Study Course is to provide students with the opportunity to pursue, for academic credit, a particular area of special interest beyond the scope of current course offerings. Up to 9 Independent Study credits may be granted towards graduation requirements.

**DEADLINE:** This packet must be submitted to the Registrar's Office by the last day of finals week prior to the quarter this study is to be completed; i.e. to do an independent study next quarter, this packet must be turned in by the last day of the current quarter. Packets missing information or signatures will not be processed.

## **Steps to Register for an Independent Study**

- 1. Verify your eligibility:
  - Be a junior (90 units) or higher
  - Have a 3.5 cumulative GPA or higher
  - Have space in your degree plan for an independent study (elective space)
  - Available space in your class schedule for the upcoming quarter
  - An independent study may be taken for credit up to 3 times
  - The work to be completed will provide 90+ hours of work within a quarter
  - Must meet one of the following three criteria:
    - Supplements existing courses in the curriculum with deeper study in a subject area
    - Delves into topics of special interest not currently covered by a regular course in the JPCatholic curriculum
    - Work on specific projects that are designed to extend the student's knowledge in a particular subject area
- 2. Identify and invite a full-time faculty member to oversee your study
- 3. Meet with instructor to discuss:
  - Outcomes
  - Assignments
  - Weekly meetings
  - Final reflection paper
  - Obtain approval with signature
- 4. Schedule meeting with the Registrar by deadline to finalize the approval proccess:
  - Review **100% completed** application and certify all necessary signatures

#### Long Answer

- What deliverables did you produce?
- ▶ How did the deliverables demonstrate you achieved your learning outcomes?
- > Please include a few examples of your work (remove identifiable components as necessary)
- > Describe challenges you faced and how you overcame them.
- What advice do you have for future students?
- ▶ How have the experiences and skills you've gained fit with and/or shaped future goals?
- ▶ How did this experience connect to your program and overall learning experience at JPCatholic?

The reflection paper has no length requirement, provided each question is answered to the fullest. The reflection paper is distinct from any essays or term papers. Such papers should be listed as a separate assignment.

- > How will you make connections between your classroom learning and outside experience?
- > What new topics or subjects do you expect to learn about?

- What do you think will be a challenge for you? What will be an area of strength for you?
- How will you develop your critical thinking and problem solving ability?
