Dear Audience,

Thank you so much for joining us for the annual musical, Little Women.

Based on the classic book by Louisa May Alcott, *Little Women* premiered on Broadway in 2005. Due to the style of the musical numbers, a contemporary quality is blended with the Civil War era.

My family first discovered this musical many years ago, and I have memories of listening to it on road trips, as well as seeing it performed live together. The characters in this musical often represent some universal archetype (such as the caring mother, the romantic young lover, or the passionate, driven artist) which then allows their specific desires and humanity to be most expressed through their individual songs.

While many musicals focus on spectacle, something unique about this style of musical is that its heart lies within simplicity. There's the simplicity of family life; suffering; loss; love; marriage; babies. As the play comes to a close, Jo shares with us, "Sometimes when you dream, your dreams come true in extraordinary ways. Suddenly a day can be so amazing. And sometimes when you yearn you burn the air. And then you are not the same..."

Her desires to be "astonishing" and great are fulfilled in the paradox of the profound simplicity of love. I'm reminded of the words of author George Elliot, "The growing good of the world is partly dependent on unhistoric acts: and that things are not so ill with you and me as they might have been, is half owing to the number who lived faithfully a hidden life..."

Thank you for joining us on this paradoxical journey.


