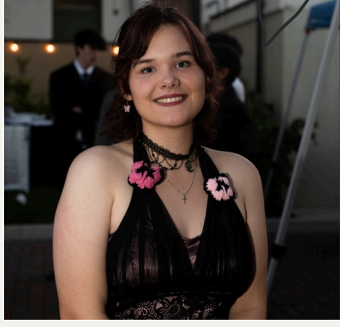
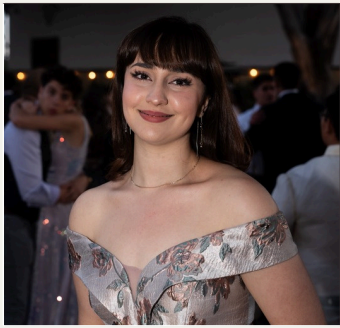




















# PENTECOST PARTY

# TONGUES OF FIRE CHALLENGE

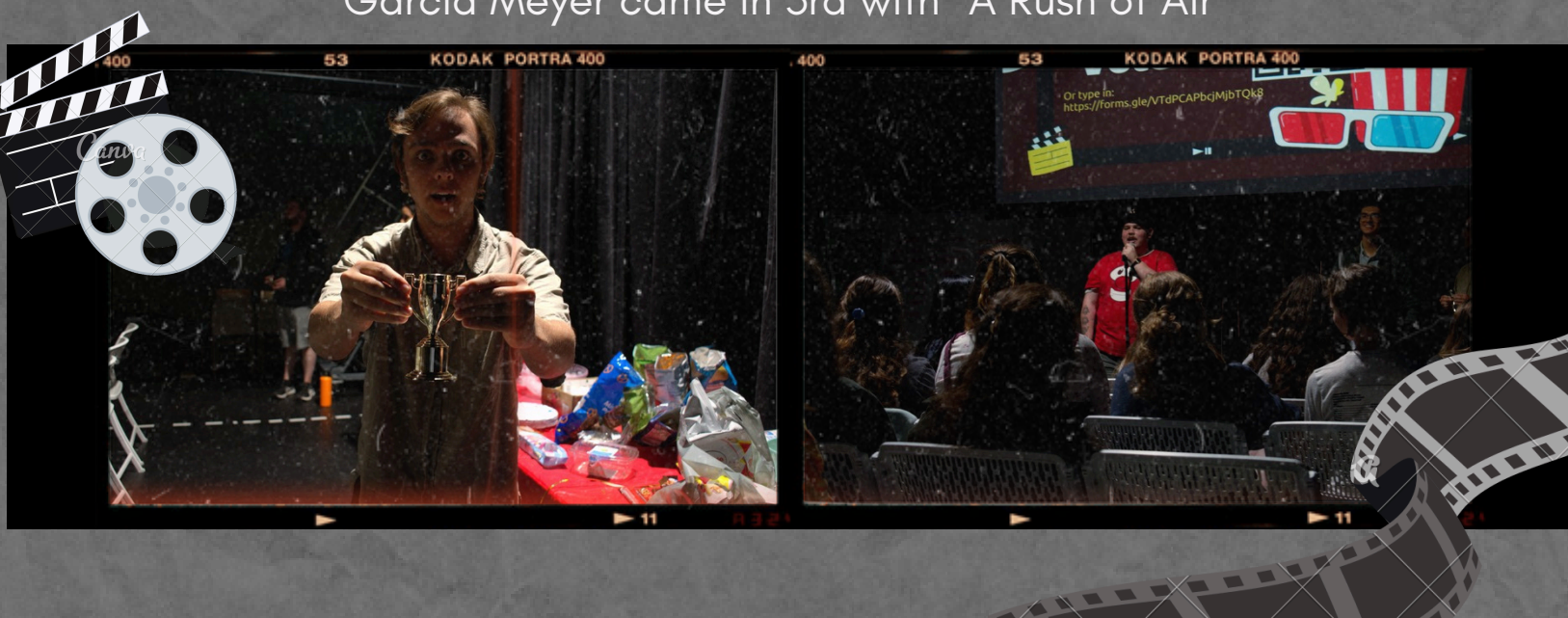

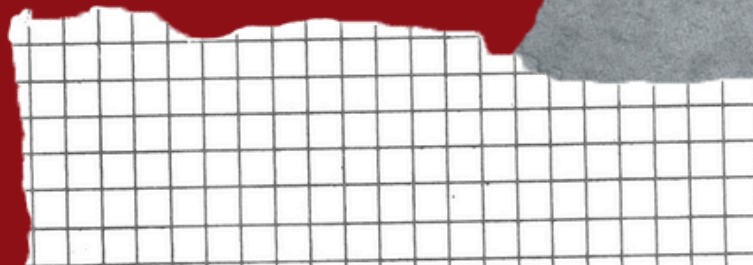
